I received this book as a part of the Goodreads promotion. I was not paid to review and I am not familiar with the author.

After reading the the extra long sentence in the blurb on the book's back cover, I dreaded opening the book. Sad to say, the first few pages did not give me hope that I would finish this book. The initial scenes that set the tone for the book were simply a little too muddling for me. The book also needs another run through with an editor to make corrections to sentence structure and punctuation.

I am glad I stuck with the book however as by chapter 6, the plot did become more interesting and it was difficult to put down the book at the point. Overall, the book has a good premise that I think will be helped by a few tweaks. My suggestion is that the back blurb be one of the first things re-written.

From a solely indie point of view, I recommend beginning the page numbers at Chapter 1 as it was weird to see the Title page and the rest of the front matter with page numbers. Additionally it would be aesthetically pleasing to give a title to your dedication/acknowledgement page.

Overall, I would recommend this book. I only wish there were half stars as I think this book deserves at least 3.5 stars as a book I like.
