Simon Lester Henry Strauss is not afraid of anything. He's not afraid of witches, ghosts, or vampires, screaming ghouls or goblins. Simon Lester Henry Strauss and his friends visit a haunted house, and while Simon's friends run and scream from all of the house's ghastly inhabitants, Simon loudly proclaims that "I'm Simon Lester Henry Strauss, and I'm not afraid of this haunted house." This is a humorous and delightfully creepy rhyming story.

I was initially drawn into this book by Teresa Murfin's Tim Burton-esque illustrations. They have the perfect mixture of cute and macabre (in one scene Simon is sitting at a table eating "blood and brains" and "guts and veins") to make the book fun and gross but not too scary. Children will enjoy Simon's repeated proclamation that "I'm Simon Lester Henry Strauss, and I'm not afraid of this haunted house" and will likely want to join in on his refrain. While this book is perfectly suited for reading during the Halloween season, it never directly mentions Halloween (there are no jack-o-lanterns or trick-or-treaters in the story). *I'm Not Afraid Of This Haunted House* is a fun storytime read regardless of the time of year.
