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This book is like a ride on fast-running train; the images and visions change from each other in a quick, fragmentary manner

You can see the unfamiliar faces of people, scenes from their lives, landscapes, and sometimes incomprehensible footage

You can't completely figure out what every single snippet means, but every such picture submerges you into the thinking about life, about the nature of things, about the Way

Every sentence is a little meditation that provokes an outburst of thoughts, emotions, and contemplation

The poems are very positive; they inspire seeking, thriving, doing

Every one of them is a journey to the inner self, to the macro-cosmic and microcosmic levels of existence, to the awareness of Oneness of all things

This is a slow read; a read in zen-style: You don't need to understand every word; you must feel it, resonating somewhere in your guts, bones, teeth; the impulse to live, be aware, and be at one with your surroundings
