I read this for continuing education credits and found it a very helpful little book. It does, indeed, make psychopharmacology very easy. It covers, briefly, major psychological diagnoses and then goes through the recommendations for medication. It does not cover the mechanism of action in detail, which prevents it from being excessively long or complicated. The information provided is pretty much out of the scope of my practice (RN), but I did find it helpful for a basic overall understanding of how disorders are treated.
